## Airport guide

### Zurich airport.

*Name:* Zurich Kloten Airport.

*Location:* 12 km (7 miles) north of the city.

### Your arrival in Zurich.

After landing at Zurich Airport, proceed through the passport control to the Arrival Hall for customs inspection, formalities which require only a few minutes. Having picked up your luggage (luggage carts available free of charge), choose the green lane if you have nothing to declare.

If, however, you have something to declare, take the red lane which automatically leads you to the customs officer's desk.

Money can be changed in the Arrival Hall.

The train journey to town takes about 10 minutes (fare SFR4) and taxis cost about SFR35, tips included. If you have made arrangements for a self-drive car to meet you at the airport, inquire at the Car Hire Desk in the Park House, opposite the terminal building.

At the Central Railroad Station (C5) right in the center of the city, close to several good hotels is the Zurich Tourist Office, which will gladly assist you in securing hotel accommodation, should you have made no previous arrangements. In German-speaking Zurich, as in fact everywhere in Switzerland, you will have no language difficulties, since French and English are widely understood. The SAS people are your friends – they are there to help you and will be glad to answer your questions.

### Basel airport.

*Name:* Basel/Mulhouse Airport.

*Location:* 12 km (7 miles) northwest of the city.

### Your arrival in Basel.

After your arrival in Basel, customs inspection and passport control will take place. If you have nothing to declare, follow the green signs. The red signs will guide you to the customs officer for inspection of dutiable items.

The bus trip from the airport to the town terminal takes about 15 minutes and the fare is SFR6 per person; for a taxi expect to pay SFR25 including tip. Self-drive cars are also available at the airport.

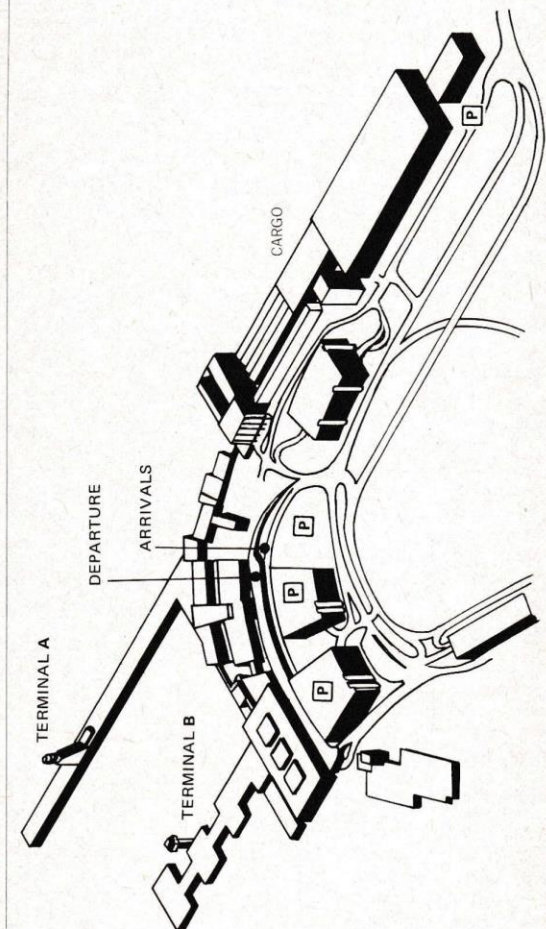
The town terminal is situated in the Central Railroad Station (SBB) from where there are good train connections to any place in the country as well as to Germany or France. The Tourist Office is located inside the station building.

### Geneva airport.

*Name:* Cointrin International Airport.

*Location:* 4 km (2½ miles) northwest of the city.

**Your arrival in Geneva.**

After passing through the passport and customs check-points within the Arrival Hall, you will come to the main airport building, where there is a Passenger Welcome Service able to assist you with hotel reservations, car hire, sightseeing, and a notice board which you should consult, if you are expecting any messages.

Here, too, are the post and telegraph offices, a bank, restaurant, hairdresser, bars and various shops. The bus-stop and taxi-stand are just outside the exit hall. It is only a ten-minute drive to the Air Terminal in town (D4). Bus fare SFR5 or by taxi, SFR22 including service charge.

If you have arranged for a self-drive or chauffeur-driven car to await your arrival, you should go to the Information Desk, where the keys (or driver) will be waiting for you.

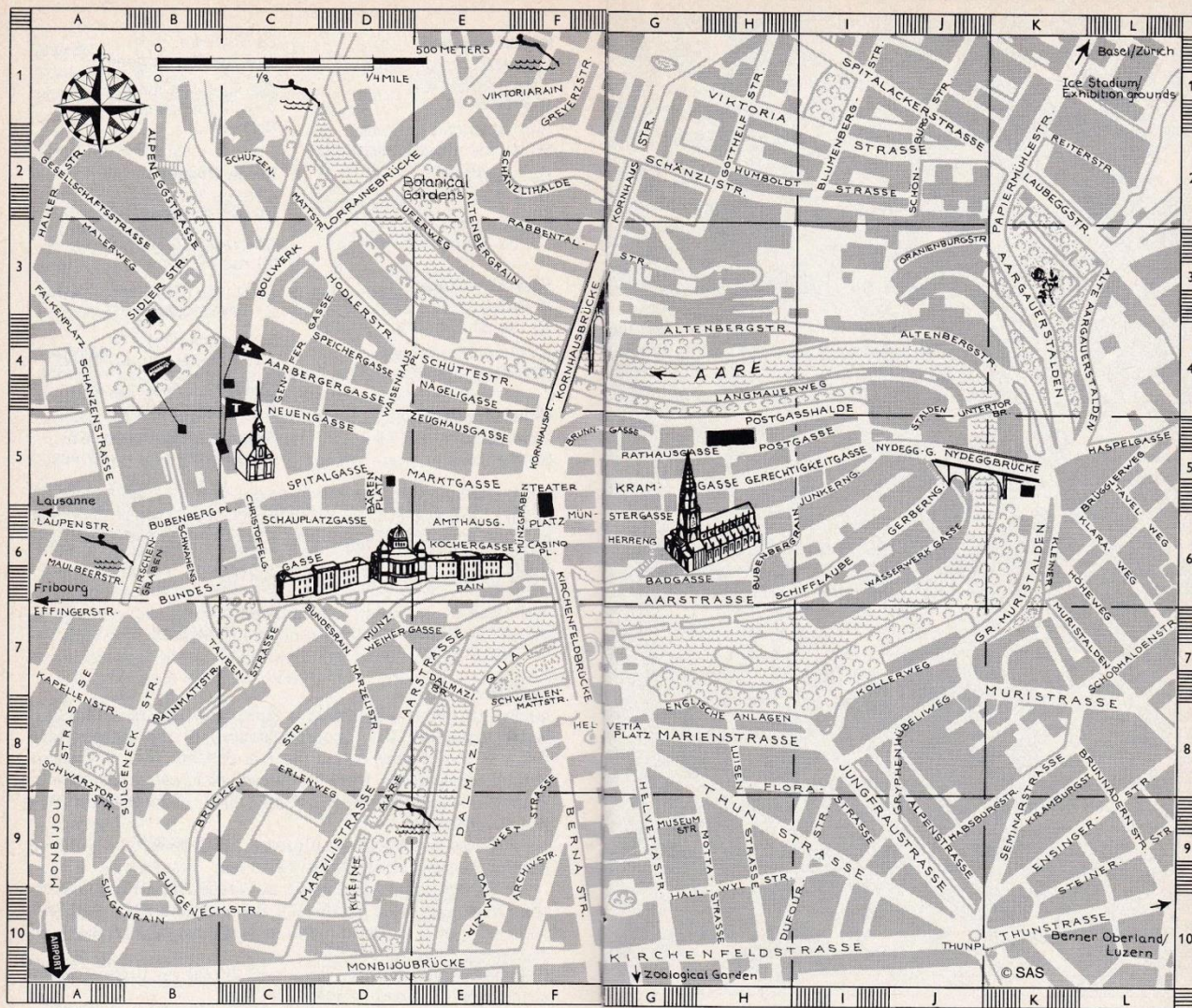
The Air Terminal (D4) is in the Cornavin Railroad Station, affording easy access to taxis, trolleybuses and buses, and centrally located in relation to many of the tourist hotels.

**Your arrival in Berne.**

As there is no SAS flight to Berne you arrive via Zurich, Geneva or Basel. Customs inspection, etc. take place at the airport of arrival. From these gateway cities, you continue to Berne by train. The most convenient connection is from the new train station at Zurich Airport which offers hourly links with Berne. The traveler leaving Berne can also check in luggage at the station in Berne for any destination in the world ("Fly-luggage").

If you have any queries, check with the Official Tourist Office, located in the Main Railroad Station. The Tourist Office will also assist you in arranging for hotel accommodation, if required. At the station you will also find the currency exchange office which is open daily between 06.10 and 22.00 hrs.

Berne belongs to the German-speaking section of Switzerland, but being next to the French-speaking part this language is also widely spoken in the capital; and English, too, will not cause problems, as it is widely understood in Switzerland.

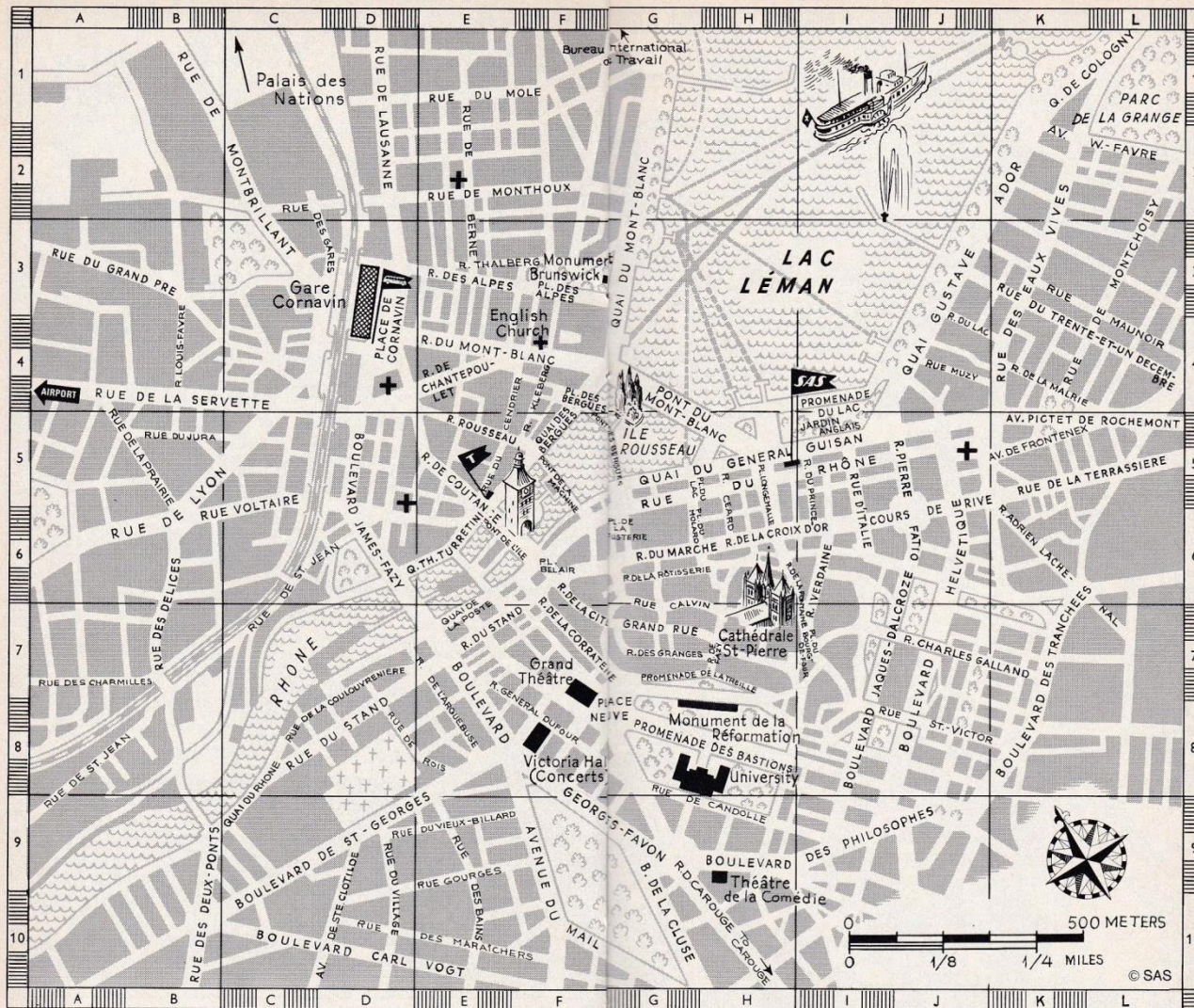

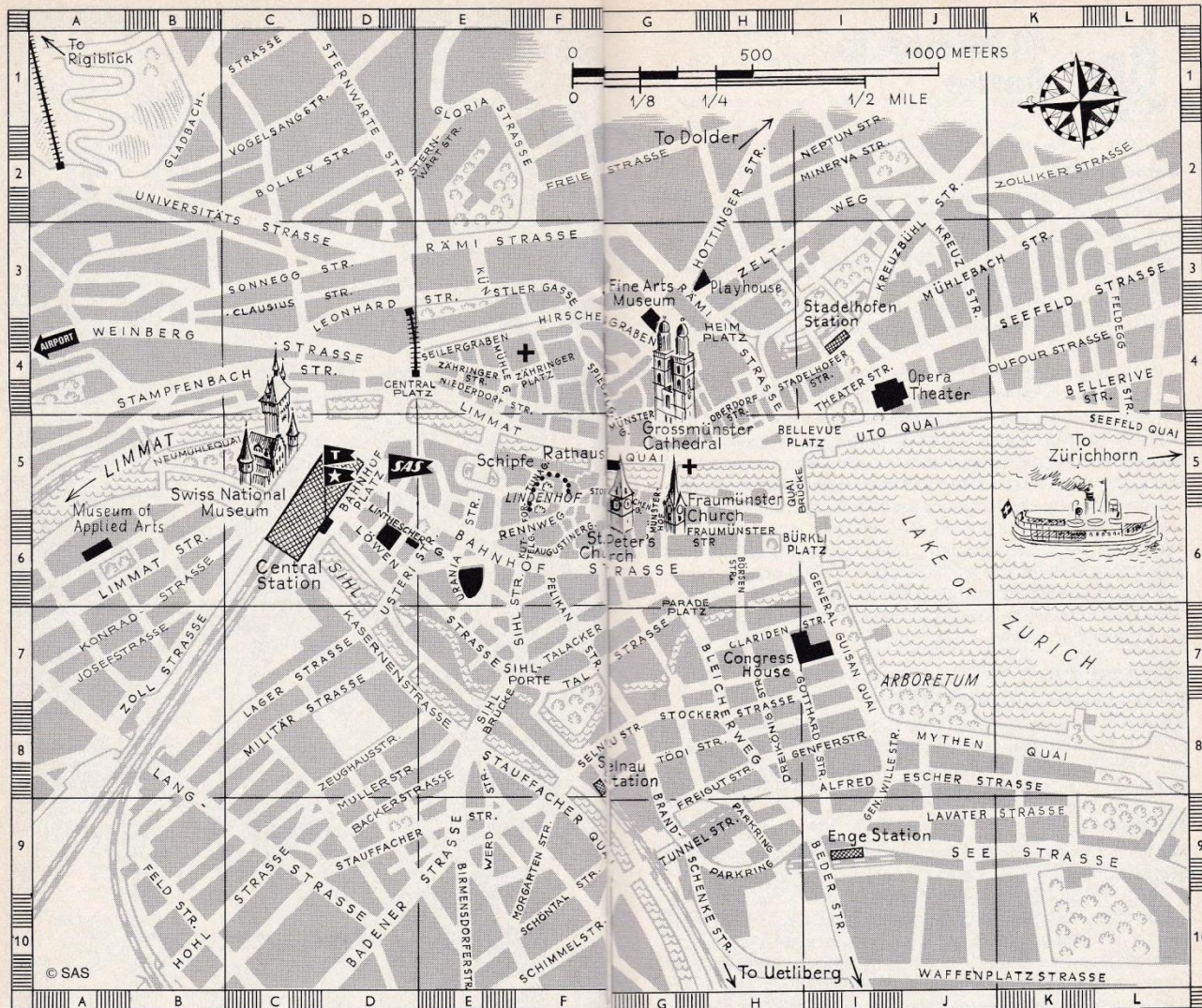
